Brampton SC – Assessment Days / Tryouts Information







Question	Answer
What is an Assessment Day?	 Terminology we use at BSC for players U8-U12 to determine both interest and fit for Development Level Soccer. All Players are assessed and placed as Target, Development or Recreational levels at these Age/Stages of development.
What is a Tryout?	 Traditional terminology used at BSC for players (U13 and up) for Competitive and OPDL Pathway Teams. Players attend specific dates and times for the purpose of being identified and selected for BSC representative teams playing at the District, Regional and Provincial competition levels.
How does a Player Join BSC Development Team	 BSC holds "Assessment Days" and "Tryouts" each Fall at the conclusion of the summer Season. Schedules are posted online and are open to all players by end of August.
Are all current BSC players required to register and attend Assessment Days or Tryouts?	 Yes Current players are required to register and attend all Assessment Days/Tryouts for the next season
If I'm only interested in the BSC House League Program, do I have to attend Assessment Days/Tryouts?	 NO Only players interested in BSC Development. Competitive and OPDL Pathways are required to attend.
How do I register for Assessment Days or Tryouts?	 All registrations must be done online. To register, Visit <u>www.bramptonsc.com</u> select "Register Now". Existing players can log in and Non-BSC players can create an account (by selecting Sign Up)
How many players are selected?	 For Grassroots Development Teams (U8-U12) there is no upper limit to the number of players that can be selected. Depending on the number of players, BSC reserves the right to determine how many teams it will enter into the PHSA each year. For Competitive/OPDL Teams (U13 and up) – BSC aims to select a min of 16 players per squad and max of 20 players. BSCD reserves the right to determine how many teams are available at each age group/gender.
What if I miss Assessment Days/Tryouts?	 If you miss Assessment Days/Tryouts, you can contact the coach directly and inquire able the availability of a tryout. However, coaches are not required to accommodate requests if they have a full squad.
How many Assessment Days/ Tryouts should I Attend?	You can attend as many or as little dates as possible however, the more you attend, the better the coaching staff are able to make an informed decision.
